

A-LEVEL PSYCHOLOGY

This course gives students a very real and valuable insight into how people think and what motivates them. Topics students will study on this course are; memory, attachments, research methods, relationships, paranormal psychology, stress, OCD and mental illness.

Students will explore social, cognitive and psychological development and discover techniques for collating and analysing data.

In addition to this, students will experiment with the approaches and research methods used in psychology to give them an understanding into the fascinating workings of the minds of people.

Duration: Two years

Entry requirements: Five GCSEs at A*-B and maths, English and science minimum C grade.

Course content: A fascinating range of topics that will give students an insight into the human mind and behaviour.

Final grades will give the following UCAS point scores of: C-80, B-100, A-120, A*-140.

On successful completion of the course students will have the skills and qualifications needed to progress onto a wide range of courses at foundation or degree level, or to go directly into industry.
